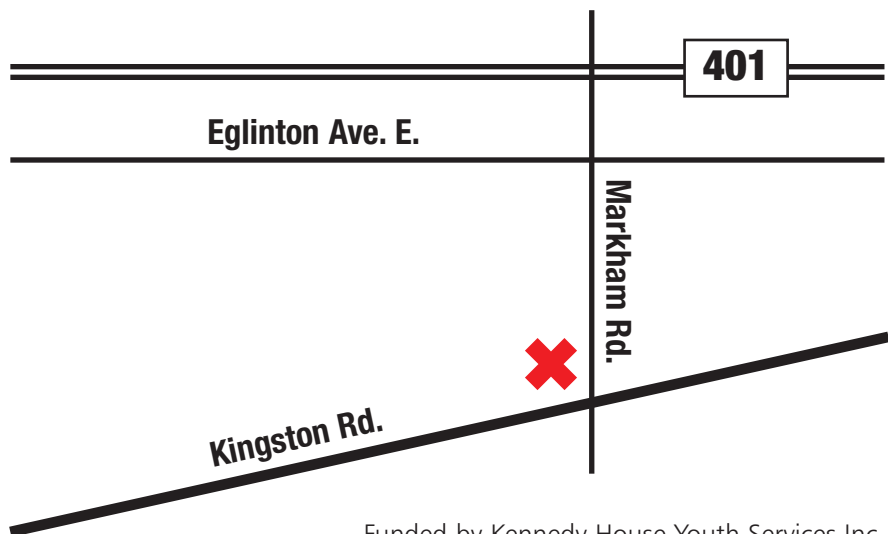

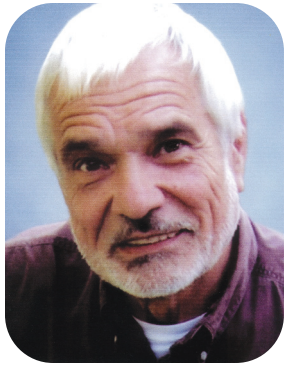

**Dr. Kim Snow, Ph.D.**

Dr. Kim Snow has extensive practice and experience with both frontline and management in children's mental health, child welfare and youth offender settings. She has taught child rights and youth services at the graduate and undergraduate level. Dr. Snow will discuss the fundamentals of relationship building in the field of child and youth care. Frontline CYC practice necessitates long term thinking and planning while at the same time getting through the day-to-day moments by helping young people gain skills. Helping young people build skills for the present and the future requires the development of relationships. Focusing on the use of self in therapeutic work, Dr. Snow will discuss the fundamentals of strength-based practice and meaningful engagements and the importance of rhythms, rituals and stability to the relationship.
